Science Center

The Hartford skyline has been redefined with the distinctive Connecticut Science Center building, designed by world-renowned architect Cesar Pelli.

The building is a total 154,000 square feet. The Pfizer Foundation Science Discovery Center is home to four educational laboratories and a community room. The 460-space Science Center/Riverfront parking garage is directly adjacent to the Discovery Center, along with back-of-house support services such as the loading dock and recycling facility. Directly above the parking garage is the main structure of the Science Center and a plaza which connects to the riverfront and downtown Hartford.

In mid-2010 a pedestrian bridge will open between the Science Center plaza and the Connecticut Convention Center.

A signature feature of the Connecticut Science Center is the Magic Carpet Roof, under which is a soaring, light-filled atrium that is 143-feet at its tallest point.
